LECTIO DIVINA - Sundays of Advent 2008: There are booklets at the back of the Church with a Foreword from Bishop David Walker offering us an opportunity to work with the Scriptures so that our hearts will be imbued with their message. The booklet's principal focus is a meditative prayerful reading of the Gospels of the Sundays in Advent. It can be done alone or can be a shared experience, in which a group meet to share their *lectio*. Please take a booklet home with you.



Midnight Blue - 1st Sunday of Advent Advent marks the start of the liturgical year but Australia's mood is one of closing down and going on holidays. Liturgical symbols and colours developed out of the experience of the Northern Hemisphere, suiting the rhythm of the seasons as people experienced them. Hence the purple of Advent reflects the grey, purple, darkening wintry skies of the Northern Hemisphere at this time of year.

Purple speaks more of Lent and penance than it does of the anticipation and expectation of Advent. Blue is the colour of our jacarandas, agapanthus and hydrangea. It is the blue of our dazzling skies, day and night, and of the coastal waters to which we flock from this time on throughout summer.

We explore how Advent 'under the Southern Cross' can speak to the multicultural Australian heart - with people drawn from Asia and all other parts of the world as well as Europe.

Midnight blue recalls the long night of waiting by God's people for the fulfilment of God's promise. In the long night of sin rise the prophetic stars of promise: 'a Saviour will come'.

Blue is Mary's colour. The blue of Advent reminds us that Mary travels with us on our 'journey of faith'. Through Mary, God's promise is fulfilled. Her attitude of faith will help us keep Advent prayerfully.

NEWS FROM CANDELA: We have received a number of reports from Candela this week and wanted to share them with you.

As reported on the Catholic News Website: In Peru for the APEC Summit, Prime Minister Kevin Rudd has paid a visit to an Australian Sisters of Mercy project in a Lima slum area. Mr Rudd visited Cerro Candela (Hill of Candles), one of the shanty towns on the city's outskirts where three Australian nuns have battled for 12 years to improve the lives of tens of thousands of the city's poorest, *The Age* reports. When Mr Rudd arrived there at the weekend with an escort of well armed Peruvian

police and his own security detachment, he was greeted by a delightful bedlam of dancing, singing and clapping children. They held banners saying in Spanish "Thank you Australia" and waved paper Australian flags they had made themselves with numbers of stars that varied from just one to galaxies.

From Karen Middleton SBS Journalist traveling with the Prime Minister: Half an hour's drive out of central Lima is a place that leaves you speechless. Cerro Candela is, literally, dirt - a barrio, a slum, a bowl of dust, with a terraced dust hill rising above. In this village the colour of moonscape, where children play in a grim haze of asthma-inducing grit, there's no running water and no sewerage. The roads are rocks and after that, more dirt..... Prime Minister Kevin Rudd brought us, his journalistic entourage, to Cerro Candela to see the work of Australian members of the Sisters of Mercy and their brother colleagues of the Columban Order in one of the truly poor communities of the world.... The people here suffer respiratory disease and parasites from all that dust. They have tuberculosis. They live in such overcrowded housing that sexual abuse and domestic violence are rife. And here, Australian Sisters Joan Doyle and Patricia MacDermott and another colleague who's away being treated for cancer, have established a health clinic to try to help. It costs them \$US70,000 a year to run and it runs on donations. When they built it, they included a room to house a \$45,000 x-ray machine - TB is detected by chest scan - that they knew they simply couldn't afford. They didn't have the machine, or any prospect of buying it, but they built the room anyway, believing the Lord would provide. When Mr Rudd announced today that the Australian Government was stumping up the money for the machine, and some other inexpensive pathology equipment, the people of Cerro Candela - Spanish for "Candle Hill" - cheered and clapped and waved home-made Australian flags.... for these two utterly dedicated Aussie nuns and this community which finds joy when despair dares it every day, it was the answer to their prayers that what was needed would come, some day. This afternoon, Sister Doyle and Sister McDermott giggled like a pair of girls who had known all along. "Today's the day," Sister Doyle said, her smile widening. Sister McDermott nodded. "Today's the day."

From a Columban friend of Margaret Acret: Most of us "Aussie" Columbans were present; Tricia & Joan had let us know during the week that the invitation had been accepted and that the P.M would make the trip ("99% possible" !!) out of Lima to the area and see the Health Centre. "Candela" is part of the Columban Parish where Peter Woodruff is P.P. There were certainly "rays of hope" on the smiling faces of children and adults out at "Cerro Candela" last Saturday morning with the visit of P.M Kevin Rudd !! It definitely made this past weekend, which also saw our celebration of St Columbans Feast Day (Nov. 23rd), a memorable one !!

From Sister Patricia McDermott to Mary Rajca and others: Hello there to you all! What a day it was yesterday! We still can't believe it all happened! Thanks for all your phone calls, emails etc It was certainly a day to remember- and Kevin Rudd came through as a very caring person! The people loved him! There will probably be a lot of babies now called Kevin here! Lots of love Tricia

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMENT We hope you had an opportunity to view *A Well-Founded Fear* last week. Phil has said that "as a result of the screening, the Edmund Rice Centre received hundreds of phone calls, emails and web responses from members of the public calling for justice to be afforded to the refugees and rejected asylum seekers who were deported to danger". Responding to the calls for action, Phil has advised there are three ways people can help. The **first** and simplest is to sign the online petition on the Edmund Rice Centre's website www.erc.org.au; **secondly** write to your Federal MP (either Dr Brendan Nelson or Mr. Philip Ruddock, depending on your address) and to Senator Evans, calling for an urgent reopening of the cases of the asylum seekers removed to danger from Nauru and to encourage the government to continue with immigration reforms; **thirdly** if you are able to financially support the work of the Centre, donate via www.erc.org.au/donate or mail cheque to the Centre PO Box 2219, Homebush West, NSW 2140

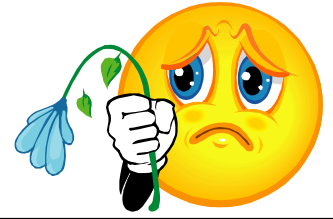
