ANNUAL MASS to remember parishioners who were farewelled from our Parish churches in the past year will be held today at the 10am Mass at St Patrick's. Relatives of those who have died have been invited to gather at this Mass to honour the memory of their loved ones. Mass will be followed by morning tea in the Church forecourt.

Remembrance Day in Australia is dedicated to Australians who died as a result of war, particularly from World War I onwards. A minute of silence is dedicated to the deceased, especially for soldiers who died fighting to protect the nation. Remembrance Day is annually observed on November 11. Please pray for those who have lost their lives in the service of our country. Father Robert will be participating at the Cenotaph at Berowra for the Berowra RSL Sub-Branch at 11am on Thursday 11.



Tuesday November 9 Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

The anniversary of the dedication of the Lateran Basilica, erected by the Emperor Constantine in 333, has been observed on November 9 since the twelfth century. This is the oldest, and ranks first among the four great "patriarchal" basilicas of Rome. The official cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope, the Lateran Basilica is a symbol of the unity of the Church. Its altar stands alone among all the altars of the Catholic world in being built of wood and not of stone, and enclosing no relics of any kind. The reason for this peculiarity is that it is itself a relic of a most interesting kind, being the actual wooden altar upon which St Peter is believed to have celebrated Mass during his residence in Rome.

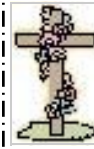
Parish Children's Choir

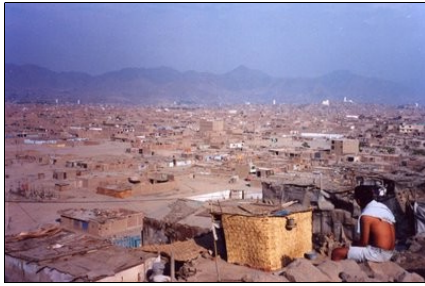

The Diocese of Broken Bay will be holding a Synod beginning in 2011 and concluding in 2012. The Synod aims to **Celebrate the past, Engage in the present, and Envision the future.**

While there will be many activities and opportunities to participate in the process of the Synod on a personal, parish, deanery and Diocesan level, there is a way that members of our Diocesan faith community can be involved right now.

We know that for our Synod to reach its fullest potential it must be grounded in prayer.
